- For the ASP, BSD, CSD, SD, VETE-CCD, CR, SPD and CQ applicants, an opinion letter will be requested from the promoter by the time of the validation.

The decision to allocate the grants and fellowships will be made by the Board of Trustees of the Fund for Scientific Research-FNRS (F.R.S.-FNRS) in June 2019. The grants and fellowships will begin on 1st October 2019.

3. Changes compared to Call 2018

3.1 Selection of the scientific commission

It is recommended to applicants who wish to have their application file assessed by <u>Scientific Commissions</u> dedicated to SEN (Exact and Natural Sciences) and SVS (Health and Life Sciences) domains to submit their application in English. Applicants who will select the SHS-2 are recommended to submit their application in English as well [decision of the Board of Trustees on 4 October 2018].

Should the application file be submitted in French, the F.R.S.-FNRS may require the applicant to provide a translation in English for the purpose of conducting the <u>ex-ante evaluation</u>.

3.2 Seal of Excellence Certificate

Postdoctoral applicants (CR, CQ, SPD or MISU) who would be awarded a "Seal of Excellence Certificate" after the validation deadline fixed for the postdoctoral applicant may add this piece

of information until 1st of May on a dedicated page at https://e-space.frs-fnrs.be, as a follow-up of their application file [decision of the Board of Trustees on 21 June 2018].

3.3 Part-time clinical fellowships (SD, CSD, SPD)

Following the meeting of the Board of Trustees on 4 October 2018, rules and regulations have been amended as follows:

CSD	 Clinical training: Most of the training in a university hospital or a university hospital department located in French-speaking Community of Belgium (federal Law)⁴, Part of the training (max. 12 months FTE⁵) in a Belgian non-academic hospital or a Belgian hospital department not related to a university (federal Law) and, Under the supervision of an academic coordinator training supervisor who performs their clinical activity in a university hospital (federal regulations) or a university hospital department as identified by the F.R.SFNRS⁴. Concerning CSD fellowships granted as from 2019, second renewal applications are subject to an evaluation performed by a Scientific Commission. 		
SD,	During their part-time fellowship, clinical practitioners must carry out their <u>clinical activity</u> in a university hospital (federal regulations) or a hospital department as identified by the F.R.SFNRS ⁴ .		
SPD	The accreditation (recognition as a specialist which authorises to practice the speciality in Belgium) may be issued by one of the three Communities responsible for accreditation.		
	During their part-time fellowship, clinical practitioners must carry out their researc activity in a university of the French-speaking Community of Belgium which has a facult of medicine offering a complete curriculum, a university hospital (federal regulations) of a university hospital department as identified by the F.R.SFNRS ⁴ .		
CSD, SD, SPD	By the time of each renewal application (except for the 1st SPD renewal requested by the applicant), clinical practitioners are required to provide a report on the scientific activities.		
	The F.R.SFNRS will reimburse half of the full-time annual cost of the part-time clinical practitioner to the hospital upon reception of the supporting documents. Cost (on-call duties not included) includes salary cost plus all direct and indirect salary costs. In 2020:		
	Temporary doctor6€50,700-Permanent doctor€67,100-		

3.4 MR / DR promotion

In order to reduce applicants' workload when writing their proposal, MR and DR applicants to the promotion at hand will have to provide a description of their research orientation for the next 5 to 10 years (in 2 pages max. using the <u>template</u>), instead of a comprehensive 4-page description of their research project as formerly required [decision of the Board of Trustees on 4 October 2018].

4. Specific remarks

4.1 Doctoral Researcher fellowships

The result of the Master thesis, if available at the latest by the validation deadline fixed for the applicant, will be communicated to the Scientific Commission.

4.2 Doctoral Researcher fellowships Renewal

Research Fellow (ASP-REN), Medical Doctor Applicant to an MSc and a Ph.D. (CSD-REN), Clinical Master Specialist Applicant to a Ph.D. (SD-REN) and Veterinary MD. Ph.D. Student (VETE-CCD-REN) Renewal fellowships applications will be evaluated by the Supervisory Panels (Thesis Advisory Committees).

4.3 Special Doctoral Grant (BSD)

BSD applications will be evaluated by the Supervisory Panels (Thesis Advisory Committees).

4.4 Part-time Post-doctorate Clinical Master Specialist fellowship (SPD-REN) Renewal

The **first renewal** shall be requested during the second year of the fellowship and simply upon request by the applicant. The request needs to be validated by the promoter and the host institution on <u>SEMAPHORE</u>. **From the second renewal on**, the application will be subject to an evaluation by the relevant Scientific Commission.

4.5 Ulysse Incentive Grant for Mobility in Scientific Research (MISU)

For any requested staff unit the promoter shall contact the relevant service of her/his host university in order to establish an estimation of the staff cost based on the scientific seniority. <u>Amounts cannot be changed after application submission.</u>

Technician and Short-term Postdoctoral Researcher categories are subject to an annual amount, calculated in proportion to the days worked. Limitations in force in 2020 are the following:

➤ Technician	€58,300- (full time) - €29,600- (part time)
➤ Short-term Postdoctoral Researcher	€51,700-

As for the MISU, since the F.R.S.-FNRS is the employer of the Postdoctoral researcher, the promoter shall take into account the annual cost provided. Amounts in 2020:

Postdoctoral Researcher	€80,100- (full time) - €40,200- (part time)

4.6 Ethical aspects

As from 2018, in order to reduce the Ethics Committees workload and to make the administrative procedures more flexible for applicants, the researchers concerned by ethical questions will be required to submit their questionnaire accompanied by the opinion of the Ethics Committee to the FRS-FNRS only in case of granting. Funding will be subject to a <u>favorable</u> opinion of the Committee (decision of the Board of Trustees of the F.R.S.-FNRS on 4 October 2017).

THE CONTENT OF A PROPOSAL

Applicants will have the choice to write their proposal either in French or in English⁷. For some fields, using English can broaden the number of experts likely to take part in the evaluations. The <u>guide for applicants</u> provides further information about the content of a proposal.

The F.R.S.-FNRS insists on **strict compliance with the instructions given for each part of the proposal** (scientific section relevant to the instrument selected, number of pages allowed for documents to be enclosed with the application form...) and stresses again the sovereign consideration of the Scientific Commissions assessing the application file.

The application file contains the main sections described in the table below.

As mentioned under section 3.1, applicants are recommended to write their proposal in English if their application is assessed by SEN (Exact and Natural Sciences), SVS (Health and Life Sciences) and SHS-2 (Human and Social Sciences) Scientific Commissions.

	The applicant's list of publications (published or accepted), structured according to the template.
	 Applicants holding the academic degree of Doctor who have been working for 2 years at least in institutions of the French-speaking community of Belgium (CFB) that have set up an institutional repository (IR) must absolutely submit their publications list in a PDF format, directly created from this repository, and choose the appropriate F.R.SFNRS format. In case of publication accepted after the validation deadline set for the applicant, applicants may add them to their application file by 1st May via a dedicated page at https://e-space.frs-fnrs.be, as a follow-up of their application file.
	Bibliometric data (except for applicants applying for ASP, BSD, CSD, SD, VETE-CCD): Total number of publications, total number of citations, h-index, average number of citations and indication of the source chosen for these bibliometric data).
	Professional experience : career path, professional stays abroad of more than 30 days, academic positions, collaborations with other institutions (the 3 most important), main funding obtained.
	Applicants to a CR fellowship who are planning one or several research stays will be required to provide a letter of approval or emails exchanges which demonstrate that formalities are being processed.
	List of supervised master and doctoral thesis (only for applicants seeking a promotion as MR or DR).

Applicants who select the Scientific Commission FORESIGHT, dedicated to research projects relating to sustainable development (covering Nature Sciences, Applied Sciences, Human and Social Sciences), must demonstrate the "sustainable development" part of their research project, including interdisciplinary aspects (2000 characters max., including spaces).
	Summary (max. 2 pages) of previous research achievements (non-compulsory for ASP, CSD, SD et VETE-CCD doctoral fellowships).
	Description of the project ⁸ , it is mandatory to use the template available in English or in French. The description shall be limited to 4 pages maximum (Arial 12, single space), including the reference bibliography classified by order of appearance in the text, and divided in 4 parts: I. Goals of the research II. State of the art III. Research project IV. Work plan Graphs and charts (max. 2 pages) are authorised in addition to the 4 pages.
Work environment	Facts that assess whether the environment (the intellectual means and/or equipment available to the applicant) is consistent with the aims of the research project.
	Data can vary depending on the nature of the project, the scientific field and the type of fellowship.

Referees	Contact details (first name, surname, email) of 3 referees (only for applicants to a CQ, MR, DR, MISU fellowship).
	Applicants shall contact the reference persons prior to mentioning their contact details in the application form if they want to make sure that their referees are willing to provide a reference letter as part of their application. After the validation deadline fixed for the academic authorities (rectors), the F.R.SFNRS will contact the reference persons referred in the application form and a reminder will be sent to each referee in due course. No information will be communicated to the applicant on the receipt of the letters to ensure confidentiality.

6. SELECTION PROCEDURE (EX-ANTE EVALUATION)

The Board of Trustees of the F.R.S.-FNRS has adopted the principle of a two-step procedure:

> Step 1: individual evaluations (March to mid-April) Each proposal⁹ is evaluated by several remote individual experts, according to an evaluation grid known to the applicants (see "evaluation criteria").

> Step 2: consolidation during the Scientific Commissions (May)

Fourteen Scientific Commissions formed by 15 members (9 of which come from outside the French Community of Belgium (CFB), including the President) are gathered at the F.R.S.-FNRS to draw up a consolidated final ranking. Each proposal is assigned to a rapporteur ¹⁰ who will prepare a draft evaluation report based on the individual evaluations of the first step. The draft report will be discussed, amended and validated by the Scientific Commission and then, it will be transferred to the applicant after the Board of Trustees of the F.R.S.-FNRS has made a decision.

Thirteen of these fourteen thematic Scientific Commissions are built up from the <u>ERC</u> panels (European Research Council): 4 in Exact and Natural Science (SEN-1 to SEN-4), 4 in Life and Health Sciences (SVS-1 to SVS-4) and 5 in Human and Social Sciences (SHS-1 to SHS-5). The 14th Scientific Commission is a strategic interdisciplinary Commission (Foresight: Sustainable development).

The fields covered by these Scientific Commissions are defined according to a list of descriptor fields. This list includes the ERC's descriptor fields completed with F.R.S.-FNRS keywords, which reflect the specificities of research in the CFB.

First, applicants select the Scientific Commission they would like the proposal to be evaluated by. Then, applicants will have to choose from 2 to 6 descriptor fields in order of importance (at least 2 descriptor fields must be relevant to the Scientific Commission selected by the applicant) and they may complete this selection by adding unrestricted keywords (if necessary). The F.R.S.-FNRS will base the selection of 1st-step experts on those pieces of information along with the summary of the project.

If necessary, applicants may indicate up to 3 experts they do not wish to have as reviewers and provide a justification.

EVALUATION CRITERIA - EVALUATION REPORT

The application conditions, the goals of the different sections and the applicable criteria are detailed in the <u>guide for applicants</u>.

The applicant is free to read the <u>evaluation guide</u> intended for experts in order to better understand how the proposal will be evaluated.
